Wallace Teddy Bear Candy Cane 1987 Christmas Ornament

Description:

This splendid pendant or Christmas ornament is marked on the back with Wallace Teddy Bear Cane 1987 and it is either a Christmas ornament or a necklace pendant. It has the design on one side only, and is a splendid large piece of Wallace enamel on goldtone metal.

This is a large pendant or ornament--about 4½" long not counting the jump ring or slide.

This is a necklace pendant or Christmas ornament, and it almost looks like it was made for a pendant, since it has that kind of slide at the top. It is made like cloisonne, with enamel fill in the different areas. The enamel is ecru for the bears and green with a burnt orange or burgundy background. There is no damage, and this is from 1987.
