It's  $4\frac{1}{2}$ " tall x 3" in diameter and has no chips, but one tiny  $\frac{1}{8}$ " scratch (not easy to see)! I haven't seen another one like it online and have no idea of its age. It was purchased from an estate sale and the previous owner was an avid Murano collector. A really gorgeous piece!
