This is a beautiful large early 1900's Pima Olla basket. It stands 11" tall x 10 1/2" wide at the widest point. Nice tight weave with brown patina decorated with six lines of what look like lightning bolts. The inside is near perfect, but the outside has some missing stitches. It sits a little lopsided, but this shows up more in the pictures than it actually looks in person.
